

## **COMPETITION SHOOTING RULES**

One Hundred (100) targets will be used to determine classes. There will be four classes determined by the modified Lewis system. Classes will be drawn according to the number of Calcutta shooters. Trophy shooters with similar scores will shoot in the appropriate class. The clay shoot course will consist of ten targets at each of ten (10) stations.

If there is a clear winner at the end of One Hundred (100) targets, that person will be declared High Over All (HOA) winner and declared the AA first place winner. If there is no clear cut HOA then AA class will shoot-off. A shoot-off within each class will determine the first and second place winners within each class. Each class will start the shoot-off at its designated station to be announced after the scorecards are turned-in for scoring and class determination. The shoot-off will determine both trophy standing and Calcutta winners if different.

Trophies will be awarded for:

High overall

AA	1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup>
А	1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup>
B	1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup>

C  $1^{st}$  and  $2^{nd}$ 

## **OPTIONAL CALCUTTA**

Four Classes will divide pot as follows:

- AA  $1^{st}$  19.23% (Top two shooters and all ties)  $2^{nd}$  - 17.30%
- A 1<sup>st</sup> 15.38% 2<sup>nd</sup> – 13.46%
- B 1<sup>st</sup> 11.54% 2<sup>nd</sup> - 9.62%
- C  $1^{st} 7.69\%$  $2^{nd} - 5.77\%$
